Assessment Tool for Becoming a 100% Tobacco Free School District

A 100% tobacco free school policy prohibits <u>all tobacco use</u> (including smoking and spit tobacco), by <u>everyone</u> (including students, staff and visitors), at <u>all times</u> (during regular school hours and after school), <u>everywhere</u> on campus (including athletic fields.

This tool will help community and school leaders assess their current tobacco use policy and determine what they need to do in order to achieve a "gold standard" policy. The questions are designed to identify policy strengths, gaps in services, areas for improvement, and strategies needed to strengthen current policies. If a school district is already 100% tobacco free, this assessment tool can identify information that can be used to improve enforcement.
